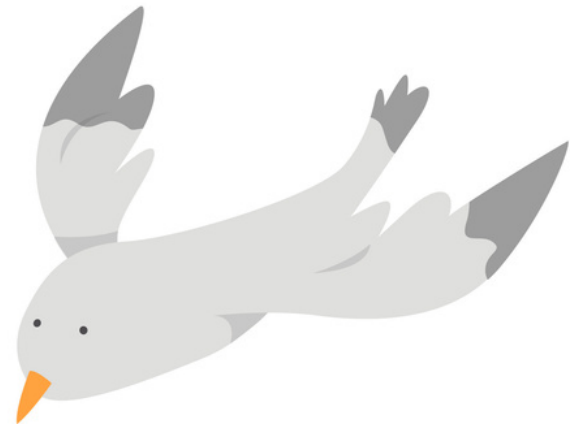

Today, the Juno Beach Park is home
to many species, just like our friend
Charlie. It is also a historical site, where
in June of 1944 thousands of my comrades
landed here to liberate Europe.
Discover the first hint inside.**



Let's start the adventure

June 6th 1944, the largest combined military operation in history, marks the start of the liberation of Europe from the Nazis. The Allied forces landed on more than 80 kilometers of beach between Ouistreham and Ravenoville. The beaches between Graye-sur-Mer and Saint-Aubin-sur-Mer were designated as the Canadian sector, code named JUNO BEACH. On these 8 kilometers of beach, approximately 14 000 Canadian soldiers landed on D-Day, all of them volunteers. After the war, nature took back the beaches and they became not only places of memory but also biodiversity. **On the Juno Beach Park, 10 caches have been hidden. You will find them by following a series of 10 hints in order to bring you to the final cache.**

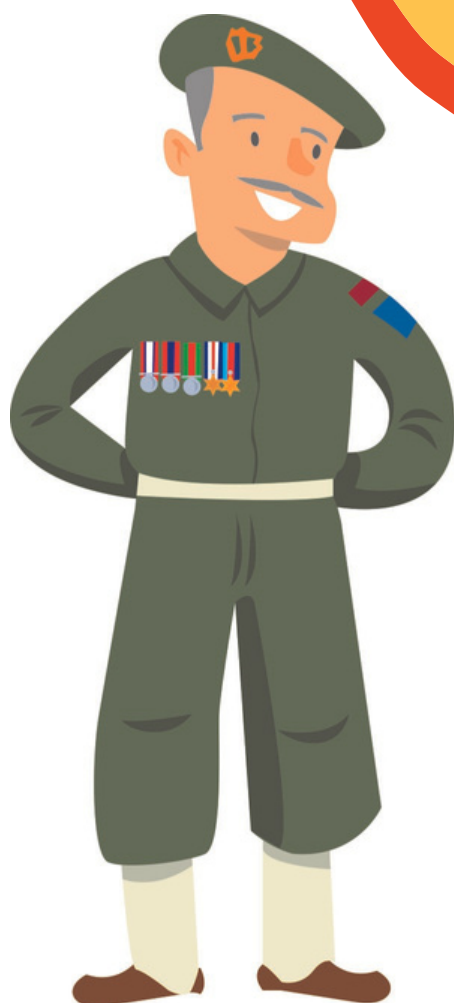
Do not climb on the bunkers or go behind the wooden fences.
